Music Fees & Requirements

Students invited to participate in the Pre-College Music Program will not be charged a fee for tuition, housing or dining. Participants will, however, be responsible for books, supplies, transportation and recreational expenses. The average cost of these expenses is around \$600. The 2008 Music Webcast Access Fee: \$25.

When applying to the program, all students must audition into a Major Studio: instrumental, vocal or composition. Please send an audio recording of a solo representative of your level of performance (vocal/instrumental applicants) or scores of recent original compositions (composition applicants). Please include a summary or resumé of your musical training and accomplishments.

Non-Credit Workshops **Instrumental Jazz Workshop**

This five day workshop is open to all instrumentalists, regardless of ability, from ages 13 to adult. Participants will rehearse in both large and small jazz ensemble situations and will perform concerts at the workshop's end. Also offered are individual instrument master classes, as well as clinics on jazz history, harmony, ear training, how to listen to jazz and solo transcription. The faculty performs in jazz session daily for the participants and selected students will be invited to play with the faculty at the end of the week. The Monday afternoon faculty concert, Friday afternoon pizza party and shopping at Volkwein's jazz store are also highlights of the week's activities.
